<p>Safe from hazards. This includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Injury, slip/fall risk</li> <li>• Chemical risk</li> <li>• Biological risk (illness)</li> <li>• Natural disaster (severe weather)</li> <li>• National disaster (mass power outage, terrorism)</li> </ul>	<p>Related to physical safety, specific to environmental controls. This includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• prevention measures (alarms, testing of alarms, inspections of equipment, etc)</li> <li>• response to emergency situations (first aid, smoke/fire conditions)</li> </ul>	<p>Security of structures and environmental design. This includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Access control</li> <li>• Entrance/Egress</li> <li>• Capacity (occupancy limits)</li> </ul>	<p>Safety from violence and crime. This includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cyber security</li> <li>• Security of belongings</li> <li>• Crime prevention</li> <li>• Personal physical safety from crime</li> </ul>	<p>Climate or perceptions of individual experiences both in and out of the classroom. This includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Social support options</li> <li>• Availability &amp; accessibility of resources</li> </ul> <p>AND, how each individual may infringe upon safety of others</p>
