Notes:

- 1. We recommend that students take BC1001, but a student with accepted AP/IB credit can take another PSYC course in its place.
- 2. Group 1 & 2 labs must be taken with their respective lectures, in the same semester. BC1010 can accompany BC1001, or be taken in a later semester; but should be taken before Group 1& 2 labs.
- 3. Submit the Senior Requirement Declaration Form to the Dept. Admin by the semester drop date.
- 4. Only two semesters of the following courses may count towards the major: PSYC BC3465/66, BC3601-3608, BC3617/18.
- 5. Note that PSYC BC1020 is a pre-/co-requisite for BC1001; and can be used to fulfill one lecture course of the College Science requirement. Also, students are encouraged to take BC1020 at the same time as BC1010 lab.
- 6. Choose from the following: an additional PSYC lab (taken with its lecture); an additional lab in a science outside of Psychology; or one semester of Independent Study (BC3601-3608).

General Guidelines:

- At least 6 of the 8 PSYC courses worth 3 or more credits each must be taken at Barnard or Columbia.
- A letter grade of C- or better must be earned in all PSYC courses applied to the major. Any required courses from outside of Psychology can be graded P/D/F, as long as a student receives a "Pass."
- A student cannot receive credit for two courses that are considered to be equivalent. Refer to our *Overlapping Courses* list.
- A single semester of a course cannot count toward more than one major requirement.
