Degrees granted include all degrees granted in each department/program in October, February, or May of the given academic year. Students who double major are counted once in each of the departments/programs in which they earned a degree. Students who have a special or combined major are counted in the first or primary department administering their major.

Unduplicated headcount is the total number of students who earned a degree in the given year. This number counts students who double major only once and will be lower than the total degrees granted.
