## Featured Funder: [The New York Public Library](#)

The New York Public Library offers a broad spectrum of [fellowship and scholars-in-residence programs](#) for researchers across disciplines. The most well-known is The [Dorothy and Lewis B. Cullman Center for Scholars and Writers Fellowship](#) program, which supports writers of all stripes with book projects that will benefit heavily from NYPL's research collections. Each year, 15 Fellows receive an \$85,000 stipend to support their writing and/or research project, as well as private office space in the Cullman Center in the Stephen A. Schwarzman Building at Bryant Park. In addition to space and funds, Fellows benefit from a close-knit cohort and opportunities to present their work to a wide variety of guests, including publishing professionals like Farrar, Straus and Giroux's Chairperson Jonathan Galassi, who has championed Fellows' work after learning about it through the Center.

Applications are due annually in the Fall, with awards announced in the Spring. Fellowships begin the following September.

Also of note: additional Fellowship programs specific to NYPL's various research libraries include: short- and long-term fellowships at the [Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture](#) and [Lapidus Center for the Historical Analysis of Transatlantic Slavery](#); NEH-supported [Long-Term Fellowships](#) for scholars in the humanities (\$45,000 stipend); the [Martin Duberman Visiting Fellowship](#) for work in LGBTQ studies (\$25,000 stipend) and the Jerome Robbins Dance Division at the Library for Performing Arts' annual [Dance Research Fellows](#) (\$10,000 stipend). ## Sage Advice: Executive Order Updates and the Recent OMB Federal Funding Freeze

In the past week, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) posted two memos that impacted higher education. [Memo M-25-13](#) (January 27, 2024) announced a temporary freeze on federal grants through February 10, 2025, but was rescinded just two days later by [memo M-25-14](#) (January 29, 2025).

This particular pause was short-lived, but it has prompted Barnard and other educational institutions to assess our preparedness to cope with potential sudden changes in the administration of federal funding that may greatly impact grantseeking and management. Although we have limited guidance for next steps from the original memo announcing the freeze, IFSR is working with our colleagues from Finance, the Provost's Office, and General Counsel to ascertain what the guidance in the memo means for our community and how best to support faculty and staff. We are also exchanging experience and insights on the best ways forward with colleagues in grants offices at peer private liberal arts colleges. With many colleagues across the country, we anticipate there may be future disruptions. We have reached out to federal funding agencies, though none of the agencies are responding to inquiries right now. Nevertheless, IFSR will continue to fully support all grant activities at Barnard.

As always, we are committed to timely and accurate communication. A reminder that our office hours are an appropriate place to ask questions, get clarification, and discuss any concerns about events that impact the grants community.
