Featured Funder: MacArthur Foundation

The John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation, established in 1970, is one of America's largest private philanthropic foundations with assets of approximately \$7 billion. Founded by insurance entrepreneur John MacArthur and his wife Catherine, the Foundation is dedicated to building a more "just, verdant, and peaceful world" through supporting creative people, effective institutions, and influential networks. The MacArthur Foundation is perhaps best known for its Fellows Program—often referred to as the "genius grants"—but its work extends far beyond, addressing critical societal challenges through grantmaking in areas including climate solutions, criminal justice reform, journalism, nuclear risk reduction, and advancing racial equity. The Foundation operates with the belief that significant and lasting change happens when people and organizations work together to leverage their collective power, maintaining a commitment to innovation, creativity, and risk-taking. The MacArthur Foundation generally doesn't accept unsolicited proposals, but the Foundation does review them and invites Letters of Inquiries. You can test your eligibility for a project here. Also note that "from time to time," the Foundation announces open calls for proposals to "advance specific program goals." Please find some of the MacArthur Foundation's grants and programs below:

- 100&Change: "100&Change is a competition for a \$100 million grant to fund a single proposal that promises real and measurable progress in solving a critical problem of our time. The competition is open to organizations working in any field, anywhere in the world. Proposals must identify a problem and offer a solution that is meaningful, verifiable, durable, and feasible." | Funding: \$100 million; Deadline: Competitions held approximately every three years, with next cycle anticipated to open May 2026-2027
- ⇒ Journalism and Media Grants: "The Journalism and Media program supports the production of high-quality, independent journalism that contributes to a strong democracy and culture of engaged citizens. Focus areas include strengthening U.S. democracy, addressing the climate crisis, advancing racial and ethnic justice, and expanding technology in the public interest." | Funding: Varies by project; *Deadline: Rolling, letters of inquiry reviewed*
- Climate Solutions Grants: "The Climate Solutions grant program aims to limit global warming by significantly reducing greenhouse gas emissions while advancing a just energy transition. The program focuses on decarbonizing the power, transportation, industry, and building sectors, especially in the United States, India, and China." | Funding: Varies by project; *Deadline: Rolling, letters of inquiry reviewed*
- ⇒ Just Imperative Grants: "The Just Imperative grant portfolio advances racial and ethnic justice by addressing structural racism and supporting organizations and movements working toward a more just, equitable, and resilient society." | Funding: Varies by project; Deadline: Rolling, letters of inquiry reviewed
- MacArthur Fellows Program: "The MacArthur Fellows Program awards unrestricted fellowships to talented individuals who have shown extraordinary originality and dedication in their creative pursuits and a marked capacity for self-direction. There are three criteria for selection: exceptional creativity, promise for important future advances based on a track record of significant accomplishments, and potential for the fellowship to facilitate subsequent creative work." | Funding: \$800,000 paid over five years with no strings attached; Deadline: No applications accepted—recipients are nominated through a confidential process

Sage Advice: Grants Management Policy Updates Following NSF Site Visit

During our April 4, 2025 office hours, we reviewed several grants management policy updates that Barnard implemented following the spring 2025 National Science Foundation (NSF) site visit. For those unable to attend, this month's Sage Advice column provides an overview of the necessary policy changes.

Site visits are standard components of NSF's award monitoring and oversight of business, management, and administrative activities at awardee institutions. The purpose of the review is to evaluate the effectiveness and efficiency of the policies and procedures that organizations have in place to manage federal award funds and to provide an opportunity for NSF to offer business assistance.

In response to NSF's recommendations and to ensure that Barnard meets requirements and regulations for all federal grants, several College policies were updated by Institutional Funding and Sponsored Research, the Provost's Office, and Finance and Operations, and approved by the Provost and Dean of the Faculty, the Vice Provost of Academic Research and Centers, and the Interim CFO and VP for Finance.

The following updated policies are now posted on the <u>Sponsored Research</u> website and the <u>Barnard Portal</u>, and all active researchers at Barnard with federal grants should review and adhere to them:

- ⇒ <u>Barnard College Grant Closeout Checklist</u>: NSF recommended that Barnard incorporate its grant close-out process into its existing Post-Award procedures. *Barnard created a new document that provides the steps to be taken when closing out grants, the "Grants Closeout Checklist," that is accessible through the College's <u>website.</u>*
- ⇒ Barnard College Policy on Federal Grant Fund Reimbursement: NSF recommended that Barnard develop written procedures that describe how it completes its ACM\$ reimbursement request submissions to NSF to ensure consistency and clarity in the process. The College has published a policy that provides a step-by-step process for reviewing expenditures for each grant and initiating, reviewing, and approving reimbursement submissions, accessible through the College's website.
- ⇒ Barnard College Subrecipient Monitoring Policy and Barnard College Subrecipient Monitoring Procedures:
 - Subrecipient Monitoring: NSF recommended that Barnard develop and implement a formal written Subrecipient Monitoring Policy in accordance with CFR 200.330 and CFR 200.331. Barnard published a new Subrecipient Monitoring Policy and a Subrecipient Monitoring Procedures guidance document, both accessible through the College's <u>website</u>.
 - Subrecipient Risk Assessment: NSF recommended that Barnard include as part of its risk assessment, a risk level for its potential subrecipients to ensure the appropriate monitoring activities are established for the selected subrecipient based on risk. The College implemented a new subrecipient risk rubric, incorporating a range of risk levels (low to medium to high). Details are included in the new Subrecipient Monitoring Procedures available on the Barnard website.
- ⇒ Travel and Expense Policy [STILL IN PROCESS]: In the fall of 2024, the College convened a working group to reassess the College's expense policies, including the specific requirements for using federal awards. The new policy will include General Services Administration and State Department per-diem rates and meals and incidental expense (M&IE) breakdowns. The updated policy is under review and is scheduled for implementation at the beginning of the 2026 fiscal year (July 1, 2025).
